Developed in partnership with mental health specialists Big Dog Little Dog, this new accredited training is for frontline practitioners to support jobseekers with mental health conditions in their journey to sustainable employment. This is a new and much-needed dimension to practitioners' knowledge and skills, as mental health can significantly impact job search and workplace performance. The programme covers a wide range of mental health issues from an employability perspective, including depression, anxiety, PTSD, and suicide.

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
